- Two supervisors in Pennsylvania got in a fist fight, you should always remove yourself from heated situations.
- The NRLCA has reached a tentative agreement which includes a new tier of workforce, a vote will be held on whether to ratify.

President by Michael Wahlquist

- \$142 was raised for Tom Vigil.
- Management sent the Branch a check for the remedy on the Heber crossing crafts grievance on February 4, it was due on December 31, a reneging grievance will be filed, as it was late.
- The OIG charged a carrier with delay of mail in federal court, charges were dismissed at the second meeting. Complete a 1571 for any delay of mail.
- Management is trying to enforce a new district policy, only parcels over 2 lbs can be marked.
- Our organizing numbers are up, we were at 81.9% last year and are at 84.1% this year, we have 1106 members.
