• The trustees want a report every month, people are being paid for the steak fry from the 120 days budget. Next year's budget will break the 120 days into categories such as steak fry, organizing, summer party, liability to the president (AL, SL to have a dollar amount in the 120 days). We are over budget on a few things, organizing as we pay back what CCAs paid in dues when they are fired, officer mileage due to the number of CCA conversions. Postage is over since we have gone back to a monthly pavement pounder, we went over on steward college.

Legislative by Chad Mortensen

- Today we have stamped postcards available to write a note to your representative and ask them to support door to door delivery, the bill in congress has 220 cosponsors, none from UT.
- HR 5714 requires the USPS to identify who can be converted to cluster boxes, it would also
 address the prefunding, we have missed the last 6 payments it would allow us to fully fund by
 2055. SB 2051 would require the customer's consent to move to cluster boxes. The board of
 governors would be reduced to 5 and enable local governments to establish programs.

 Chad and Kirk met last month and reviewed one and a half months, the issues that were addressed were corrected. Chad read through the dues check off to learn about dues and where they go.

- We are at 969 grievances for the year.
- Many of the phone calls received are regarding how carriers are treating each other.
- Attended an office meeting in Bountiful last week. In Magna a carrier's husband is injured, management is threatening discipline unless the carrier comes to work. The stewards protecting these carriers are appreciated.

 All bylaw changes have been submitted and are approved; including the dues decrease and proposed bylaw changes must be submitted to the secretary 30 days prior to the meeting in which they will be read. Met with Steve Chaus to discuss preparations for Christmas, which include additional trucks that
have been ordered so no u haul trucks will be rented this year. Later start times are being
discussed, any changes to start times should be grieved and the union must be notified.
 Grievances will be filed. Parcels are not a contractual reason to change start times.
